

August an Exciting Month for PVUMC!

As August approaches I am excited about the upcoming events of the next two months—

On Monday, July 25, Emily and I will travel to take part in the 20th gathering of the World Methodist Council and Conference, being held in Durban, South Africa. This is a gathering of our Methodist/Wesleyan family from more than 132 countries which has come together since 1881 for inspiration, a common witness to Jesus Christ, fellowship, accountability, and to speak as the voice of our Methodist family around the world. This year's theme is "Jesus Christ—for the Healing of the Nations". We will experience African culture, hospitality and worship, in addition to seeing some old friends, and making new friends from around the world. As a side benefit, at the front end Emily and I are taking a brief camping safari to Kruger National Park. I will return home on August 9, Emily on August 16.



I'm also excited about our 50th Anniversary Celebration on Sunday, September 11. Our theme is *Passing It On*. Bishop Al Gwinn will be preaching at our combined worship service, which begins at 10:00 a.m. in the CLC worship space; a covered dish luncheon will follow. Many of our outstanding music ministry programs will take part in worship—the Chancel Choir, the "Bridge" Praise Team, IGNITE, and our Children's Choir. We're also excited that a newly purchased "line-array" sound system should be in place by that time, which will greatly enhance the CLC worship experience for both music and the spoken word for years to come.

Also don't forget that, in conjunction with our celebration, a Musical Revue—*Celebrate 50!*—will take place on Saturday, September 10, in the CLC. Various PVUMC musicians will perform music from the past five decades for a fun-filled evening.

And in keeping with PVUMC's longtime mission outreach focus over the years, a *Habitat Dash 5K Fun Run & 1-Mile Walk* will be held at Tri-Sports, in Mayfaire Town Centre, on Saturday, August 27. Starting time is 8:00 a.m. See page 2 of this newsletter (or the church website) for info on how to register. Volunteers are also needed. *Habitat Dash* will raise funds for Cape Fear Habitat for Humanity.

A work of art has been commissioned for our 50th from local Wilmington artist of note, Ronald Williams—a framed water color montage of PVUMC. We're told it's beautiful. Prints will be sold or ordered in conjunction with our 50th Celebration.

Well, as I reported at our July 18 Church Council meeting, in the first quarter of 2011 we averaged 583 in worship attendance; over the second quarter that number was 619. I'm pleased that we are adding a new Children's Ministry Coordinator to our staff. In so many ways it seems that momentum is building as we seek to be faithful to Jesus Christ in moving forward as a church in mission and ministry.

Last month, at Annual Conference, we were challenged to look at ways to redirect the flow of our attention, energy, and resources as local churches in order to increase the vitality of our congregations in making disciples of Jesus Christ. I feel Pine Valley is doing just that. We need to remember in this process that leaders don't always have all the right answers; but leaders must always ask the right questions. It is my continued hope and prayer that, as we work together in building the kingdom of God through the ministry of PVUMC, we will continue to ask such questions as—What do we want to accomplish? When do we want it to happen? And perhaps most importantly—Why does it matter? That last question is always in my mind as I consider Jesus' commission in Acts 1:8—"You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in Judea, in Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." May Pine Valley UMC continue *Passing It On* as a strong presence for Jesus Christ in the decades to come.

New CLC Sound System

Great News! For six years we have known that the CLC sound system needed to be replaced. PVUMC is able to take advantage of a unique opportunity to upgrade the CLC Gym sound system at a discounted price. The recommended system was originally quoted at \$52,500. We are able to purchase the same system ("demo" model) and warranty for \$33,000! Church Council approved the expenditure of \$33,000 to take advantage of this significant savings. Since \$8,000 is available through our Board of Trustees, the Council also approved a \$25,000 loan in order to complete this time-sensitive acquisition. We anticipate having the new sound system installed prior to our 50th Anniversary Celebration on September 11. Our PVUMC members excel in generosity, and we hope to raise \$25,000 prior to September 11 to cover this capital expense. (We've already received 10%, or \$2,500, from one church member!) We are excited about moving forward as a church family with other staffing and capital projects needing to be addressed in the near future. We are also mindful of our responsibility to be good stewards of what God has already entrusted to us as we move forward into God's future for PVUMC.

Pastor Jared's Report on Haiti

Last month, Lauren Holmes and I had the experience of being a part of God's promise in Haiti. I will briefly say that Lauren and I could fill a year's worth of newsletters with stories and new insights into the meaning of church, mission, and God's children.

In the midst of extreme poverty, little to no sanitation system, political ineptitude, earthquake reminders everywhere, etc, we stayed in a church compound in Terre Noir. The compound also housed a school and a small sewing business. We performed hours of manual labor mixing a concrete slab and repairing a rocky soccer field. But it was the time with the Haitian people and visiting the three orphanages that spoke to our hearts. We visited Wings of Hope, an orphanage for mentally and physically handicapped children, who many in the country deem possessed by demons because of their condition. We heard the tale of a child being rescued by one these boys who would not stop letting others know he heard a crying girl in the rubble next door after the earthquake.

One Haitian worker thanked us for coming...not to work but to witness him working. The Haitian people have a saying that "if it's free, it's worthless". The dignity of labor is not lost on all. Of course, we all know that God's love is free to all and that is vividly apparent in the hours of worship Sunday morning and the many dark nights filled with the sounds of the impoverished coming to the church of Terre Noir.



There are many examples of these faithful people finding beauty in the ordinary and transforming scrap metal into beautiful works of art. God is in the business of healing the broken, making the ordinary extraordinary, and making all things new. May God continue to bless the country of Haiti.

Meet Our New Children's Coordinator

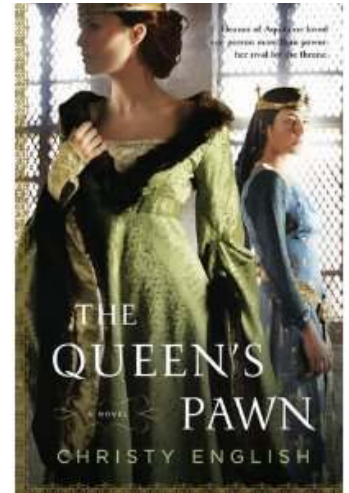
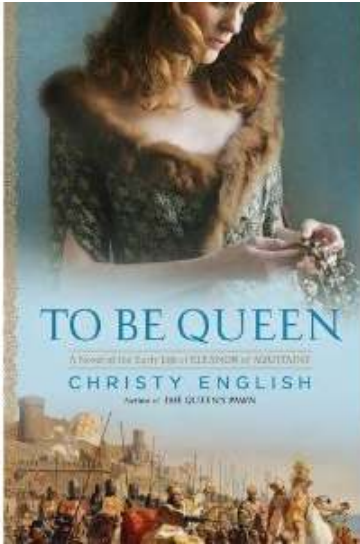

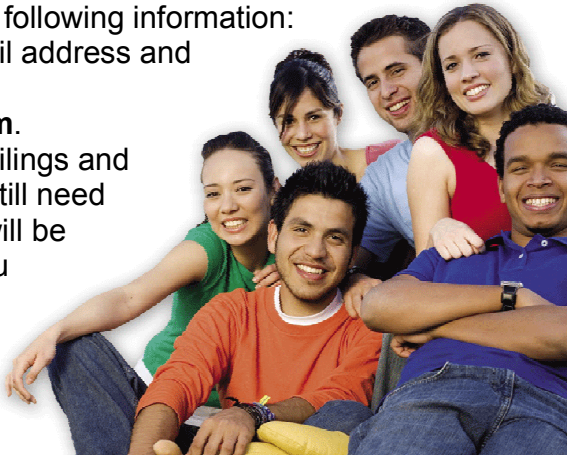


College Students... Let's Stay in Touch
