

From Your Pastor

This year Pine Valley UMC will focus on a second emphasis from the book, "Five Practices of Fruitful Congregations". Our focus last year was *Radical Hospitality*, and while we will continue this vital practice, in 2012 we will look at *Extravagant Generosity*. I intend to share something in regard to this important theme each month in our church newsletter, and this month's article is about building nests. It comes from a devotional book by Robert Schnase called, "Practicing Extravagant Generosity". Schnase is Bishop of the Missouri Conference of The United Methodist Church.

And the things you have prepared, whose will they be?
—Luke 12:20

"During the months to come, birds of all kinds will pour extraordinary effort, time, and ingenuity to the construction of nests, the protection of eggs, and the feeding of their vulnerable young ones. After the little ones hatch, I'm always amazed at the unceasing care offered by the parents. Every ounce of the adults' energy is devoted, not to their own comfort and feeding, but to the survival of their young.

"The notion of building nests is often used as a metaphor to describe people successfully providing for their own comforts. If

someone arrives at a career position of some ease and security, friends say, "You've built quite a nest for yourself here!" When we are comfortable, secure, and feel at home in our workplace or living area, we talk about the space being "our own little nest." The word *nest* often connotes shelter, coziness, homelike, comfortable.

"In actual fact, the nests which birds build

are not for the birds who build them, but for their young, for the next generation, for the future of the species. The hours of carrying straw, sticks, and mud; the days of defensive watchfulness; and the weeks of endless feeding are all for the benefit of the new ones, the young, the future.

"Now consider "nests" we build in our churches. The buildings, programs, ministries, job descriptions, and services we build—are they for our own comfort and coziness? Or are they to further the faith and provide for future generations? Does our giving serve us and our

needs or serve God by serving the mission of the church to reach new people? Vibrant, fruitful congregations focus as much energy, prayer, and planning on those who are outside the congregation as they do on those who are already active in the congregation. When they initiate new Bible studies, outreach ministries, or worship services, they give less emphasis to "what do I want, prefer, or find convenient" and

place more weight on "what will feed the souls, nourish the spirits, and sustain the steps" of those outside the church or new to the faith. Those new to the faith are as vulnerable as hatchlings, and require a steady and dedicated effort of feeding. And the budding faith of young people requires our committed attention, extra care, overtime in planning, teaching, encouraging, generosity, mentoring, and support. For those who practice Extravagant Generosity, the nests we build are not for ourselves—they are for the next generation, those new to the faith, the future of the body of Christ."

Bishop Schnase offers the following questions for us to consider—

- ◆ What motivates you to support the ministries of your congregation?
- ◆ How does your focus on generosity and level of giving support the mission of reaching other people with the grace of God you have received?

I think these are good questions for believers to ask themselves. And I hope you will take a few moments to consider your response.

Common Threads Ministry



On Monday, January 23 the Common Threads Circle met with 14 ladies in attendance. After introductions, Jeanne Scott began the meeting with a devotional based on Kay Warren's book Dangerous Surrender, which was Jeanne's inspiration to begin the Common Threads ministry. Following a UMW pledge service and a brief business meeting, the ladies got to work making the butterfly pillowcases that will be given to Hospice. Some ladies measured, some cut, while others sewed and ironed. In January, over \$500 was raised by spending two days making and selling homemade cinnamon rolls. More than 130 dozen cinnamon rolls were sold to buy the fabric for these pillowcases. Another way that they earn money to purchase the material is by selling beautifully embroidered Common Threads sweatshirts and T-shirts

for \$22 and aprons for \$15. Currently Jeanne is able to purchase the butterfly material directly from the manufacturer who kindly pays the shipping. Since the ministry began in the summer of 2009, 1037 pillowcases have been distributed to AIDS and Hospice patients. In their first circle meeting they were able to complete 18 pillowcases and pinned more that were taken home to be sewn. Several of the members will deliver the pillowcases to Hospice. Common Threads Circle will be meeting the **fourth Monday** of each month from **1-4:30** in the Fellowship Hall. New members are always welcome to participate in this rewarding and worthwhile ministry. 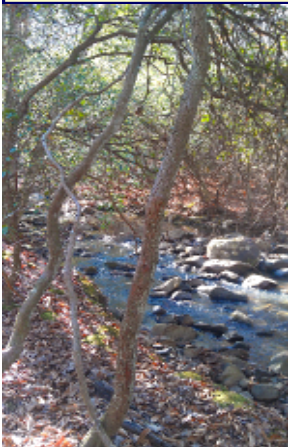


Chief Silverheels

Girl's Night!

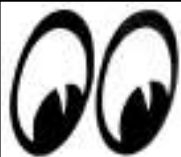

This month in Pathways Sunday School, we are working on The Lord's Prayer! Please talk with your children about the Lord's Prayer and ask them to say it with you each and every day!

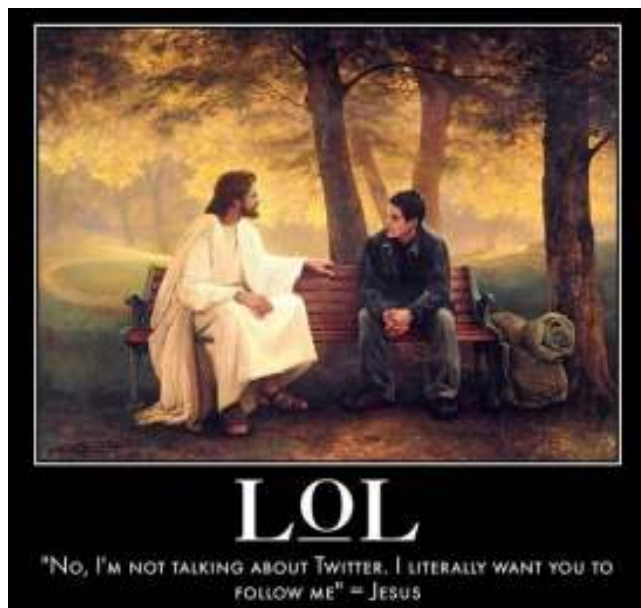

Methodist Home For Children Sunday Is February 19

We learn as children that Jesus loves us and God's promise of salvation is ours. In Acts 2:39, Peter reminds us this promise belongs also to those who live far off from God. Methodist Home for Children takes God's promise to children who live in far-off places within our own community—born addicted to drugs, abused and neglected, or lost to substance abuse, mental illness and self-destructive behaviors.

Methodist Home for Children reaches these children thanks to the grace of God and the generosity of Methodist churches in the North Carolina conference.

With your support, MHC served 1,378 children and families last year. Among them: A neglected 3-year-old who came into foster care with strong attachment fears and a habit of biting. Within three months of arriving in his new home, he had stopped biting. He has become very affectionate and now enjoys playing with other children. He is working with a speech therapist and starting to use combinations of words and identify shapes, objects and color. He's potty training. He loves having his own room, and his foster parents say he lights up the room every time he smiles.

Methodist Home for Children serves vulnerable children from birth to age 18—and beyond if they need help transitioning into adulthood without family or help paying for college. Finance Committee Report

Our preliminary financial data shows that our income in 2011 was \$1,098,961 and our expenses were \$1,129,068. WeeCare income was \$226,245 and expenses were \$222,073. Thanks to all the staff, team leaders, and volunteers who worked to provide an active year of disciple-making ministries. As we move into 2012, we ask for your continued prayers and faithfulness as we work together on "VISION & HOPE 2012"—PVUMC's Ministry Action Plan for this new year. You can pick up a copy of PVUMC's VISION & HOPE 2012 at Communications Central outside of the Fellowship Hall.

PLEDGE REPORT

We received 92 pledges for \$500,000 for 2012. You can still turn in your pledge card to the front office. 92 is approximately 20% of the total givers at PVUMC. Thank you for your faithfulness in your stewardship and we ask for all members to consider stepping up to support the ministry work of making disciples for the transformation of the world at PVUMC.

2012 BUDGET APPROVED

The budget for 2012 was approved by the Church at the Church Council Meeting on October 24, 2011. It calls for a needed weekly offering of \$21,628 which totals \$1,124,656 for the year to support the Vision and Hope for PVUMC in 2012. CLC SOUND SYSTEM PAID OFF

In 2011 Church Council approved the church acquiring a \$25,000 loan from the bank to help purchase a new sound system in the CLC Gym. Due to your extravagant generosity, the church did not need to get a loan because our members donated \$29,495 by the end of the year which covered the costs and allowed us to get some extra pieces of equipment to make the sound system work even better.

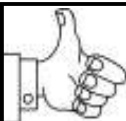
