

Pastor's Perspective

It's a typical Monday morning at the office. The Prayer Team—Connie, Julia, Roy, Arleta, Lise, and Judy—are in the Koinonia classroom praying over prayer requests received over the weekend. Gayle is rearranging yesterday's altar flowers to be delivered to homebound members. Bruce and Betty are here to put a new saying on the church sign out front. Dot volunteers in the front office. Melissa and Trish work quietly on offering receipts from weekend worship in the copy room. Susie and Connie inquire about church members who may need a prayer shawl, while their team crochets in the UMW parlor. A couple of staff members recover from Emmaus and IGNITE weekend retreats. The CLC is filled with Wee Care Preschool children and teachers. And many Ever 49'ers, youth and counselors are remembering last evening's *hoe-down* in the CLC gym (Chuck, Pat, Ralph, and Judy planned a wonderful event for senior adults and youth to mingle). Just a typical Monday morning at the church office—busy as a beehive—folks in and out the front doors... as the people of God begin a new week of service and ministry.

This is the ministry of the Laity. Yesterday we celebrated Laity Sunday, and were blessed to have Mike Page and Jerry Clark share from the pulpit in worship. Our worship liturgy affirmed that the ministry of the laity flows out of our response and commitment to Christ's love for us. I'm thankful so many members of PVUMC give tangible expression to their faith through a wide variety of ministries. Together we are living out the Christian faith! As United Methodists, we believe (and we should practice!) that every member of the church is called—"to share in the ministry which is committed to the whole church of Jesus Christ." (*The Book of Discipline of the UMC 2008*, paragraph 220)

During November we will look at another way in which we are called to give tangible expression to our faith in Christ—*extravagant generosity*—the giving of a biblical tithe (10%) to the work of Christ. Did you know that the parables of Jesus deal more with wealth than any other subject? Scripture is replete with examples and teachings that focus on possessions, wealth, giving, gifts, generosity, offerings, charity, sacrifice, and sharing with those in need. Someone has noted that the word *believe* occurs in the Bible 273 times; the word *pray* occurs 371 times; the word *love* occurs 714 ... but the word *give* occurs 2,172 times! Don't ask me who had time to figure that out, but obviously it highlights an important point—God desires that his people be generous, particularly when it comes to making his love known in the world through the Body of Christ—i.e. the church. God is extravagantly generous, the giver of every good gift, the source of life and love and salvation and hope. And so giving is *central* to our faith. We give back to God... because God has generously given to us.

In today's economic climate (and perhaps because of it), when so many people are focused on scarcity, it is imperative to hear what God's Word says about giving, for in so many ways our generosity (or lack thereof) is an accurate indicator and reflection of our faith, or our lack of faith. It is a measure of what and in whom we place our trust. Jesus said—"For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also" (Matthew 6:21).

In worship during the month of November, your pastors will focus our sermon teaching on the spiritual discipline of generosity. Also, in early November, you will receive a mailing which will include a summary of our PVUMC ministry vision and hopes for 2012, and an *estimate of giving* card in the mail. Perhaps you will decide that in 2012 you want to step up a percentage point toward the biblical tithe (i.e. from 2% to 3%, or from 5% to 7%). Prior to worship on Sunday, November 20 (the Sunday before Thanksgiving), we ask that you complete your *estimate of giving* card and bring it to worship to be offered on the altar to God.

It is my prayer that you will come to experience the joy that comes from knowing that your giving honors God and changes lives.

Psalm 100:4-5 “Enter His gates with Thanksgiving and his courts with praise: give thanks to the Lord and praise His name. For the Lord is good and His love endures forever; His faithfulness continues through all generations.”

As we enter this season of beauty and enjoy the bounty it brings, we are especially thankful for the freedom to worship as we choose. The early settlements of America consisted of many folks coming from other countries to seek freedom of religion. One such group called themselves “Sea Congregations” who assembled in Europe and traveled together to America in the 1740’s. This group later settled in Salem, N. C. and were known as the Moravians, having migrated from Moravia. John Wesley allied himself with the Moravian society and studied under Moravian headquarters but their services were too closed and against his “open air” preaching style. Later Wesley broke with the Moravians because he believed they fell into heresy by supporting quietism. He then began the Methodist Society in England and we Methodists know the rest of the story.

The PVUMC Travelers will travel to this land of N.C. Moravians on Tuesday, November 29. It will be a two day trip. Please note the following agenda:

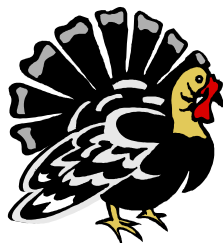

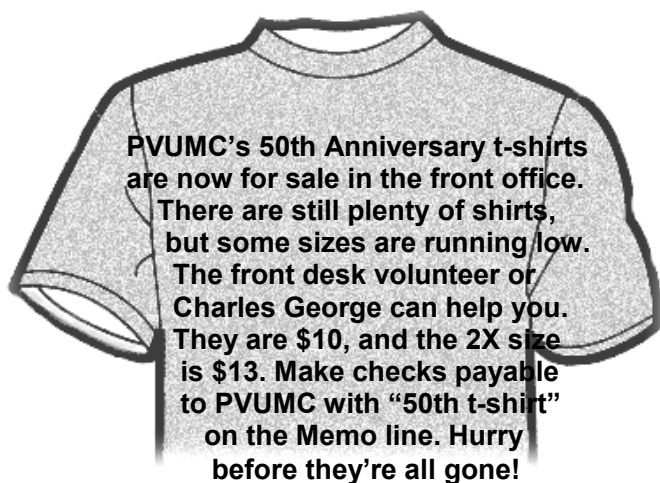
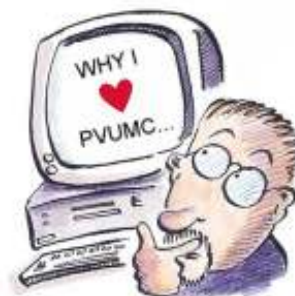
